



Hannover Chamber Orchestra

The Hannover Chamber Orchestra, known originally as the Pro Artibus Chamber Orchestra, was founded in 2005 by violinist and conductor Hans-Christian Euler.

The orchestra has performed regularly in Hanover since then, but also in other parts of Germany and abroad. Together with its conductor Hans-Christian Euler the orchestra embraces historically informed interpretations of 18th century music, as well as contemporary music of the 20th and 21st century. Recent years have seen performances of works by Mauricio Kagel, Olivier Messiaen, Pierre Boulez, Luciano Berio, Hans-Werner Henze, Wolfgang Rihm and Isang Yun.

In the context of international cooperation the orchestra has performed at various festivals in France, Poland, Italy and South-Korea (Daegu and Tongyeong).

Educational activities are deemed essential by the orchestra and its conductor for the future of younger generations. Most programs therefore are presented in special concerts for children and young students during the morning rehearsal of a concert day.
